- * Know the common causes of eye injuries, such as flying particles; chemical splashes; dust; swinging or protruding objects; fumes, mists, gases, and vapors; electrical arcing and sparks; and radiant energy from welding, cutting or brazing.
- * Use proper eye protection based on the hazards you may face on the job.
- * Inspect eye protection before each use and replace damaged equipment.
- * Follow required work procedures designed to prevent injuries.
- * Don't wear metal-framed evewear around live electricity.
- * Don't wear contact lenses in high dust areas.
- * Know proper first aid for eye injuries.
- * Clean eye protection after use. Disinfect if exposed to chemicals.
- * Store your eye protection in a safe place where it won't get damaged.

Why do ACCIDENTS happen ... By Bud Price

Here are some of the reasons:

Complacency. No matter how many times you've done a job, if you take your safety for granted, you can get hurt.

Inadequate information. If you don't know what to do or how to do it, there's a good chance you'll do it wrong. So, listen to job instructions. Read equipment manuals, container labels, and safety data sheets. And if you're not sure about something, ask!

Poorly maintained tools or equipment. Don't use unsafe tools or equipment. Report them and get a replacement.

Be Aware. Not looking where you're going or not paying attention to what you're doing. To always be safe on the job you have to be constantly alert. You need to keep looking for hazards and anticipating anything that could go wrong.

Not taking hazards seriously enough. All work hazards can hurt you in some way. Even a minor injury can interfere with your work and your life—and cause you a lot of pain.

Fooling around. Protecting your safety is serious. There's no room for horseplay.

Carelessness. Just like not keeping your eyes and mind on the road can lead to a traffic accident, not keeping your eyes and mind on the job can lead to a work accident. So always avoid distractions.

Fatigue. If you come to work tired, your chances of being involved in an accident or being injured increase. So get enough sleep before each workday.

BASIC FIRST-AID STEPS

If someone gets hurt:

Check to see if the victim is breathing
Call for medical help immediately - Explain the kind of injury
and where the victim is - Be calm and act fast
Bring help to the victim, not the victim to the help
Don't move an injured person unless it's necessary to save
his or her life

Know where first-aid kits are available Keep the victim calm and comfortable if you're not sure what else to do, and wait for the professional help

Directions

North Side Sportsmen's Association is located at: 325 Mt. Pleasant Road Warrendale, PA 15086

Traveling North on I-79

Exit I-79 at exit 75 Warrendale. Turn right off of exit. Follow Red Belt and go straight through traffic light and across Rt. 19 to next stop sign. Turn left on to North Gate road. At Warrendale Fire Hall (about 150 yards from previous stop sign), turn right onto Mt Pleasant Road. The club is on the left approximately 1 mile from the fire hall.

Traveling South on I-79

Exit I-79 at exit 76 Cranberry. Travel South on Rt. 19 to stop light at Warrendale road (Red Belt). Turn left and proceed from that point as described in directions above.

Traveling on the turnpike

Take Exit 3. Travel south on 19 for 3 lights. At the third light, turn left at the 7/11 Exxon station onto Warrendale road. Turn left at stop sign onto Northgate Rd. and then right at Warrendale Fire Hall and Camelot onto Mt. Pleasant Rd. The club is on left approximately 1 mile.
